

**EXETER BOROUGH**  
**REGULAR MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**  
**TUESDAY November 12, 2024 • Exeter Borough Building. 7:00 PM**

Vice Chairman Morgan called the meeting to order 7:01 p.m.; Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call was taken, Present: Vice Chairman John Morgan, Council Members David Balent, Joseph Esposito, Lori DeAngelo, Carmen Marranca, Richard Murawski; Mayor Denise Adams, Borough Manager Amy Huntington, Secretary Sharon Sorokin, Streets Department Vince Ninassi, Fire Department Ralph Dixon and Wyoming Area Regional Police Chief Turner.  
Excused: Chairman Pizano and Solicitor Ray Hassey.

Motion to Approve the October 1, 2024 Regular Council Meeting Minutes and October 29, 2024 Special Council Meeting Minutes was made by Councilman Balent; seconded by Councilwoman DeAngelo; motion passed unanimously.

Motion to Approve the Treasurer's Report, as read and on file, by Amy Huntington made by Councilman Murawski; seconded by Councilman Balent; motion passed unanimously. Total checks of \$155,849.18 paid.

#### Report of Committees

Police/Wyoming Area Regional Police (WARP): Chief Turner provided report, on file. 137 of 432 monthly calls were Exeter Borough; Shop-With-A-Cop Event is Saturday December 7th, 12-2pm with City of Pittston; Grant funding is being secured for bodycam/dashcams; Chief thanked Mayor Adams for invitation to speak at Veterans Day Ceremony. Next WARP meeting is Thursday, November 14, 2024, 7pm.

Finance & Insurance (Grants) - Nothing to report.

Fire Department: Councilwoman DeAngelo reported the smoke detectors were received and the the department will begin smoke detector installations. ,

Streets/Recycling: Councilman Balent thanked the Streets Department for continuing to fill cracks; they are prepping for the first snowfall.

Parks & Recreation: Councilwoman DeAngelo thanked Mayor Adams and Amy Huntington for the successful Veterans Day Event; noted the November 30th Turkey Trot route maps are now printed and available and will be posted; announced Lions Club Holiday Tree Lighting is Nov. 24 at 6pm; and Parade of Trees registration for Wyoming Avenue businesses is underway.

WVSA: Vice Chairman Morgan reported 19 sanitary sewer lines flushed and 2 lines viewed on camera, WVSA report on file.

Zoning: Councilman Murawski read October Zoning Report, on file. Total deposit was \$3,510.

Hicks Creek: Streets Supervisor Vince Ninassi noted that too much cutting will cause flooding; Councilman Murawski and Vice Chairman Morgan requested that Amy check with PennEastern Engineering to shoot the elevations and compare to the design grades, so we can accurately judge how much sediment we are removing.

Building and Grounds: No report at this time.

Council of Governments: No report at this time.

NEPA Land Bank: Councilman Balent reported Land Bank met Wed. November 6, 2024 and financials will be completed soon; next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday March 26, 2025.

Mayor's Remarks: Mayor Adams thanked the Exeter VFW Post 6518 and everyone for participating in the Sunday November 10th Veterans Day Program; Mayor read Governor Josh Shapiro's post-election remarks (attached) encouraging working together.

Solicitor's Report: No report at this time.

#### New Business

1. Motion to present the Second Reading of the Proposed 2025 Exeter Borough Budget made by Councilman Murawski; seconded by Councilwoman DeAngelo; motion approved unanimously, and budget read by Vice Chairman Morgan.

#### Open to the Public

- Resident JoAnn Teel, 20 Byrd St, thanked the Borough for cleaning Hicks Creek, requested Byrd Street be put on list for next street paving.
- Cindy Ruane, 27 Park Lane, reported high, unsightly piles of debris 12-15' above fence line at Pisano Fence, requesting code enforcement to address.
- Jeff Richards, 26 Exeter Ave, West Pittston, reported frustration with potholes in Exeter Borough's portion of Wyoming Avenue, comparing to smooth paving in Wyoming and West Pittston. Vice Chairman Morgan noted PennDOT paving twice postponed in anticipation of ripping up road for USDA sewer project.
- Donna Morgan, Sullivan Street requested water pooling on Sullivan Street be drained and repaired properly, is echoing same issue reported previously by John Hayduk; Vice Chairman Morgan requested Solicitor Hassey to file lawsuit against PA American Water Company and subcontractor who are responsible for the unsatisfactory work making for unsafe resident driving and walking conditions.

Motion to Adjourn was made by Councilman Esposito at 7:42 p.m.

Statement from Governor Josh Shapiro on the 2024 Election Results

Harrisburg, PA – Today, in response to the results of the 2024 General Election,

Governor Josh Shapiro released the following statement:

“Pennsylvania is the birthplace of American democracy, and our Commonwealth once again held a free, fair, safe, and secure election. As I have always said, the will of the people must be respected – and the people of Pennsylvania have spoken, electing Donald Trump to be the next President of the United States along with other Republicans and Democrats for state and federal offices on the same ballot.

“I know the pundits will analyze every aspect of this election, but for my part, I’m going to continue to listen to the good people of Pennsylvania, show respect for their choices, and find ways to bring people back together and move the ball down the field to put points on the board for all of us.
